Message from 19-I's District Governor Mike Dukes

Service Reporting and Why Is It Important?

Here we are moving into the month of March and I have completed 40 of my official Club visits with 13 to go. What I have learned is that we have a wonderful District made up of a group of people who I am proud to count as friends. This is a richly diverse group of people who all bring something personal to the table that at the end of each year we can be proud of.

These results show us that there is room in the world of service for us as individuals, group community service and International service to the larger world. I come away from this with a better understanding of the value of service ... not being what anyone of us does, but what we collectively do that counts for so much.

This leads me to the discussion of "Service Reporting and Why Is It Important?"

We use information to help direct our efforts to help in Service at the Club level. We answer the question "Have we communicated our goals for the year in a positive manner that promotes efforts to reach the goals?" And then plan accordingly.

For example we asked that each Club report its "WMMR's" membership activity on a monthly basis and our District currently has a 96% reporting rate, which is exceptional! We are able to use this information for having a clearer understanding of the health of our District and what we can do to improve or maintain our abilities for service. I would like to thank all of our Secretaries for this excellent work and ask you to keep it up. In the area of Service Activity reporting we are currently only showing that 51% of the Clubs are reporting. First off this is about in the middle of the results in our Multiple Districts.

Since I hope that we do a better job in this area I need to tell you why.

The data generated from reporting service activities is summarized and used throughout the Lions organization in many ways. This data helps Lions International in competing for additional funding **through forming partnerships with other service organizations to further our goals in service**. It helps in telling our story in such a manner that we become better known as an organization that accomplishes what it sets out to do in meeting service needs throughout the world. When we do this we begin to see positive results such as an increase in membership, which will increase the amount of service that can be completed with more individuals who will be part of our future leadership team.

We still have a third of the year to improve on this area of reporting our story, so I challenge us all to pull together and see if we can move our results forward to a 90% reporting rate of our service activities. Presidents and Secretaries please have this conversation with your Clubs and let's see what we can do.


