



Corn Maze/Snack Shack the club served cheeseburgers, hotdogs, chicken burgers and popcorn at the Ladysmith Lions Snack Shack.



Diabetes Awareness





November 14 is National Diabetes Day; with the month of November is Diabetes Awareness month. Hopefully your club has something planned to bring awareness to your community.

Is your club involved in the District Step Challenge? How about your club challenging each other to go an extra kilometer each day, that's about 1,400 steps a day! This is particularly important not just because of the extra steps undertaken, but the fact that Lions are walking i.e. taking exercise for Diabetes they are at the same time reducing their own risk of developing Type 2 Diabetes!

Diabetes rates in Canada have almost doubled over the past decade and will continue to rise. Unless action is taken now, one in three people will be living with diabetes or pre-diabetes by the end of the decade.

Diabetes contributes to 30% of strokes, 40% of heart attacks, 50% of kidney failure requiring dialysis, and 70% of non-traumatic lower limb amputations and is a leading cause of vision loss. (Risk of blindness being 25 times higher than those without diabetes).


A few Saturdays ago, we Fork Lions got to enjoy our family and friends annual picnic. This celebrates our year with good times, family, food, fun, and great friends.





November 15: Postmark deadline for a club to send one winning poster (per contest sponsored) to the DG.

December 1: Postmark deadline for a DG to send one winning district poster to MD council chairperson.

December 1: Postmark deadline for a DG not belonging to a MD to send one winning poster to the Brand & Creative Department at International Headquarters.

December 1: Postmark deadline for a club not belonging to a district to send one winning entry to the Brand & Creative Department at International Headquarters.

December 15: Postmark deadline for the MD council chairperson to send one winning poster to the Brand & Creative Department at International Headquarters.

February 1: International winners notified on or before this date.

The Committee for the Improvement of the Shawnigan Lake Easter Seals Camp UPDATE:2022-10-25

On July 6th we were informed by BCLS that the summer camp scheduled for August would be cancelled. Children registered were offered the opportunity to attend Camp in Winfield. Subsidies for travel were offered. We hope that those who attended enjoyed their experience and that Easter Seals will be able to offer the services at Shawnigan Lake soon.

The reason given for the shutdown was the inadequacy of the septic system.

Within 2 weeks, the caretaker at the camp for over 10 years, had vacated his residence and the Montessori school had left its premises.

Unfortunately, no one from BCLS attended the camp to properly shut it down and to supervise the move outs. The keys were handed over to one of the Malahat Lions members and he was asked to do minimal security at the Camp. The Committee was told that the only maintenance work to be done throughout the year would be lawn mowing. The Malahat Lions members changed locks on doors and installed a security camera on site.

BCLS indicated that the camp will open next year (2023) if the septic system has been replaced. Apparently, the work has started, and it will conform to the new system that will be necessary for the new facilities that they hope to build on the grounds within the next few years.

Given that the roof on the cafeteria has not been maintained and now has major leaks, and the ceiling and walls are crumbling, the Committee felt that having it inspected by a roofing company would be worth the expense, if in fact it could be repaired for the short term. The thinking was that if the septic system is complete in time for Camp next year, the Camp would still be unable to open if the cafeteria is not usable. Another year of leaking and the damage would be irreversible. We were able to find a local roofer and he offered to do the work pro bono. He has cleaned out the eve's troughs, on the cafeteria roof and on the gym and will resurface areas of the cafeteria roof. We all need to thank Matt Van Larkin from Mill Bay for his efforts to repair the roof.



Since closing, the Camp has been broken into twice. The RCMP are involved but without any success in catching the thieves thus far. Even though the Malahat Lions did remove all the newer equipment bought by the Committee recently, there were many valuables taken, including outboard motors, a tractor, printers, tv, tools, etc. and they vandalized the Camps truck and van.

The Committee wrote several letters over the summer and addressed our concerns about how the Camp has been mismanaged for years by BCLS, leaving it in its current state of disrepair. We provided Cabinet with a report about the state of affairs at the Camp. Our hope was that the Lions Clubs, Executives, BCLS Board members, and those with positions of authority in the Lions Club network would rise to the occasion and put pressure on BCLS to communicate and consult with us regarding plans for the future of the Camp. We understand that they want to build new facilities at a cost of approximately \$20,000,000.00 in the future, but what about the years before this happens? We hoped that with some pressure by the Lions Clubs on the Island, BCLS would plan a maintenance and repair program and work with us to keep the Camp open over the next few years until the construction begins on the new facilities. It appears that our concerns fell on deaf ears.

Following our complaints, we were told that BCLS would do a maintenance audit in the fall at the Camp. We were told that BCLS would provide the Committee for Improvement of the Camp, a report on maintenance for this coming year. To date, we have received nothing from BCLS.

If there is no interest, then it seems we are left with the status quo and BCLS will continue to do as it wishes with our Island Camp and without consultation with us. Please reach out to our committee should you have any input on the issue. We want to hear from our members.

How It All Began - In 1946, Louis Toban, project chairman for the Vancouver East Lions Club, announced a province wide campaign to raise funds for sick and crippled children through the sale of Easter Seals. The Seals were valued at fifty for a dollar and were mailed to almost every home in BC.

Since 1947, there story has been one of hope, courage and triumph for children, youth and adults with diverse abilities. Their goal is to provide our community with the self-esteem, self-confidence and sense of independence that is needed to help them live their best life.

1952 Five years later, in 1952, Lions Clubs and other community leaders formally established the BC Society for Crippled Children, known today as BC Lions Society for Children with Disabilities.

TODAY Now in it's 75th year, Easter Seals BC & Yukon, a service of the BC Lions Society for Children with Disabilities, is one of British Columbia's legacy charities operating for over six decades to provide programs and services to better the lives of children and adults with disabilities, and those in need of medical accommodation when traveling to Vancouver.

The fences are down and kids officially have full reign of the playground once more. Construction has wrapped on phase two of playground work at Maffeo






Sutton Park, completing an upgraded and accessible space designed for kids aged two to five.
